Since its inception in 2003, manufacturers and retailers have expanded their programs from event-based collections to include tailored electronics reuse and recycling programs.

The iGo Recycles program has the company working with Waste Management, North America's largest recycler, in order to ensure all iGo products are recycled responsibly. Waste Management recycles products in conjunction with WMRA ISO Certifications and the BAN Environmental Stewardship Pledge.
